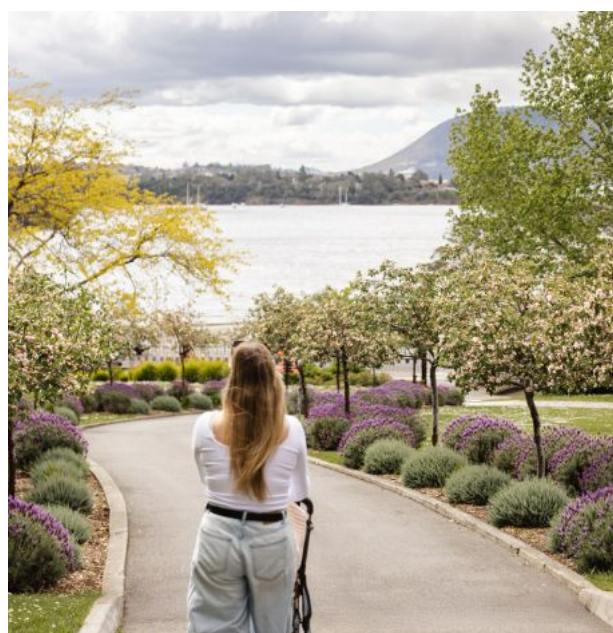

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

The English Entry Requirements at TasTAFE are reviewed annually to ensure that they meet industry standards and are in-line with expectation of the Department of Home Affairs.

All international student applicants must demonstrate a sufficient level of English language proficiency as stated below:

TasTAFE also accept a combination of two English tests, in a 12-month period, as evidence of meeting English requirement as follows:

- Two tests: when the overall results on both tests meet the required English entry, but a score on one skill (RLWS) is lower than required and meets the requirement on the second, in this case two valid results can be combined. The earliest test will be deemed the test result with 2-year validity.
- When overall results meet the required English entry, but one individual score is lower than required, in this case an English Placement Test for vocational qualification entry in one skill can be combined with the results.
- The acceptance of the combined tests also applies to the Diploma of Nursing, however, the individual score that is lower, must only be one level lower than the requirement. This requirement, including the acceptance of the IELTS One Skill Retake (OSR) is subject to change and can be confirmed via the NMBA Registration Standards – English Language Skills. <https://www.nursingmidwiferyboard.gov.au/Registration-Standards/English-language-skills.aspx>



4. You can apply for Duolingo English Test through TasTAFE as in house English placement test to meet the English entry requirement of the international education programs (Except for Diploma of Nursing). Fees may apply.

Please note while we accept the Duolingo English Test for academic entry, it is not valid for student visa application purposes. Students must meet the English language requirements set by the Australian Department of Home Affairs for visa eligibility. - Certificate IV or higher Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) qualification.
- 5 years' study experience in a specified English-speaking country where English was the only language of instruction.
- You are a citizen and hold a passport from the United Kingdom, United States of America, New Zealand, Canada or Republic of Ireland.
- Successful completion of a TasTAFE English Placement Test – Duolingo English Test (Fee may apply).

Receive your application outcome

Our International Admissions Team will assess your application and inform you of the outcome. The more complete your initial application is, the more quickly we will be able to provide you with an outcome. If successful, you will receive a TasTAFE Letter of Offer.

4.



Accept and pay your acceptance fee

Return your signed Acceptance Form and make the initial acceptance fee payment as shown on your Letter of Offer.

5.



Receive your Confirmation of Enrolment Letters (CoEs)

TasTAFE International will issue Confirmation of Enrolment Letters (CoEs) required to apply for your student visa.

6.



Lodge your Student Visa Application

Apply to the Department of Home Affairs for a student visa and get ready to start your new adventure in Tasmania.

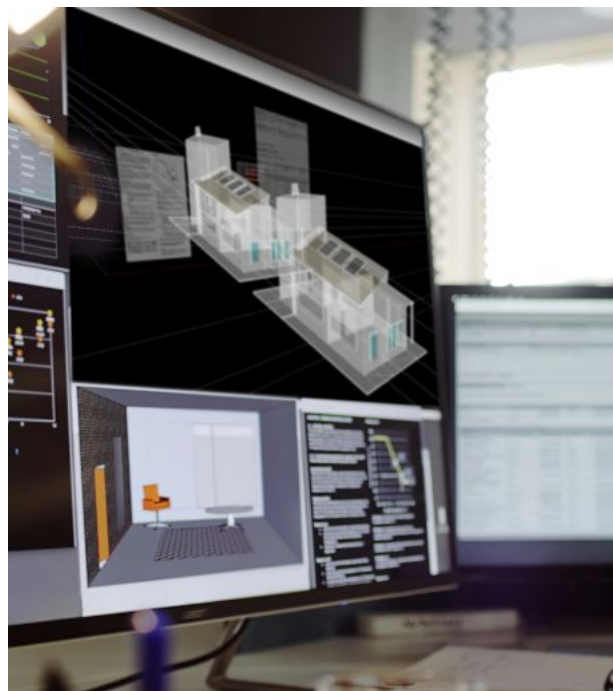
